In Memoriam Margaret Sandridge Albert

It is with great sadness that I report the death of my wife, on July 17, 1984.

We had been married for 24 years. She is survived by two daughters by her previous marriage, Susan and Charlotte, 5 grandchildren, and 2 great-grandchildren.

She had been continually involved with my chess work since the beginning of our marriage. Indeed, I showed her each new problem as I composed it - and she developed, over the years, a fine artistic ability to evaluate the worth of the various problems.

My crystallization of the ideal-mate concept dates back to the first year of our marriage, as do many of my compositions which appeared eventually in the 1963 Feenschach Aufsatz.

For these reasons, it was particularly appropriate that my 1966 book "Ideal-Mate Chess Problems" was dedicated to her.

As it turned out, she was informed by the doctor of the inevitable end only one week before her actual death, although she had been courageously fighting the cancer for a number of years. It just so happened that on this very day, IMR #10 was at the printers, ready to be picked up. It was typical of her overwhelming devotion to my work that she insisted, upon our return home from the doctor with this grim knowledge, that I immediately go and get the completed IMR, saying (I remember this so vividly): "Please drive carefully - I'm going to really need your help now".

At the end of the week, she went into coma, and then died in 24 hours, at home.

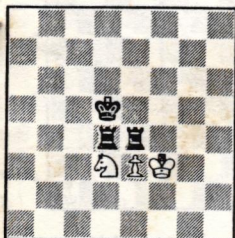
